

I don't harbor hate in my heart, just the opposite — love and goodwill towards all. I wanted our District to be recognized as the Home of Peace Conferences by organizing quality annual peace forums. We have attracted distinguished speakers — public servants, scholars, ambassadors, community and religious leaders, authors, etc.

Our records show that more than 10,000 Rotarians, Rotaractors, Interactors. and community members have attended these events enjoying the impactful presentations of 150 speakers.

Last year, 410 registrants attended the 30th annual peace conference in Las Vegas.



Dr. Quentin Wodon Lead Economist, World Bank

"The Long Term Effects of Covid-19 Pandemic: Education, Human Capital, and How Rotarians Can Help"



Dr. Wodon is a Lead Economist at the World Bank. Previously managing the unit on Values and Development; Lead Poverty Specialist for Africa; Senior Economist for Latin America. Also he taught at the University of Namur, American University and Georgetown University. Dr. Wodon is a writer with more than 500 publications, his research has been covered by major news outlets. Served as Associate Editor for journals and as President of two economics associations (the Society of Government Economists and the Association for Social Economics).

- ✓ A lifelong learner, he holds four PhDs in economics, environmental science, health sciences, and theology
- ✓ Conducted market research as Laureate of the Prize of Belgium's Secretary for Foreign Trade.
- Rotary, where he has served in leadership positions with his club, his district, and globally. He also tries to remain (barely) fit with occasional marathons and triathlons, finishing at the end of the pack.

Dr. Siobhan Nash Marshall Professor and Chair of Christian Philosophy and Philosophy Departments, Manhatanville College, NY "The Spiritual Response to Covid-19"




Siobhan Nash-Marshall holds the Mary T. Clark Chair of Christian Philosophy at Manhattanville College. Author of many academic books and articles on metaphysics and the problem of evil, she has also written books and articles for the general public—Joan of Arc: A Spiritual Biography and What it Takes to be Free: Religion and the Roots of Democracy. In recent years, Nash-Marshall has devoted a lot of attention to genocide and genocide negationism. Her most recent book, The Sins of the Fathers: Turkish Denialism and the Armenian Genocide (New York: Herder&Herder, 2018), which was released in Italy (I peccati dei padri: negazionismo turco e il genocidio armeno -Milano: Guerini e Associati, 2018), and in Armenia (Utnptnn իայրերի թուրքական ժխտողական եւ իայերեն Յայոց gtnuuyuunipjuu - Stepanakert: University of Artsakh Press, 2018) is her first book-length treatment of the topic.

After the breakout of the war in Syria, Nash-Marshall and some friends founded CINF USA, through which they attempt to help the ancient Christian cultures of the world which are presently in peril.

Eugene Whitlock has served as Vice Chancellor, Human Resources, General Counsel, San Mateo County Community College District, serving 45,000 students across three colleges. In his human resources role, Eugene led the District's equityfocused recruitment resulting in increased hiring of staff and faculty from underrepresented backgrounds. As a passionate advocate for diversity, equity, and inclusion, Eugene has been invited by the California Community Colleges State Chancellor, community colleges, and K-12 school districts throughout California to deliver training to Board members, administrators, faculty, and staff. In 2017, Eugene's work was recognized by his peers who selected him for the "Progress in Diversity" award given for "Outstanding Achievement in Support of Diversity in the Higher Education Community."

In his role as General Counsel, Eugene advised the District on general litigation, privacy and data security, wage and hour rules, disability, accommodations, leave policies, contracts, the Brown Act, the Education Code, and the Labor Code. Eugene also led the District's International Student Program, focusing on growing the program's enrollment of students from Africa and South America.



Michael Brosowski Founder-CEO, Blue Dragon Children's Foundation

"The Impact of Covid-19 on Children and Women"

Michael (CNN Hero & Member of the Order of Australia) grew up in Sydney. In 2002, Michael moved to Vietnam and established Blue Dragon Children's Foundation in response to overwhelming needs of street children. With no experience or funding, the early days were extremely difficult, Blue Dragon now serves the needs of over 1,500 highly disadvantaged children, including children and youth who have been trafficked; street children; and children with disabilities. Many Blue Dragon children are in conflict with the law or are victims of crime.

To date (August 2020), Blue Dragon has:

- ✓ Rescued 961 people from trafficking
- ✓ Represented 106 people in court cases
- ✓ Sent 5,097 kids back to school & training
- ✓ Provided shelter to 989 girls & boys
- ✓ Placed 329 teens in jobs
- ✓ Served 591,780 meals
- ✓ Built 110 homes for families
- ✓ Reunited 583 runaways with their families
- ✓ Obtained legal papers for 13,504 people
- ✓ Played 2,953 games of soccer!

"Rotary Fellowships are groups of Rotarians, Rotary spouses, and Rotaractors who join together to:


- 1. Share a common interest in worthwhile recreational activities

How Rotary Fellowships Operate

- 1. Each fellowship is operated independently of Rotary International, with its own rules, due requirements, and administrative structure.
- 2. Membership in fellowships is open to Rotarians, spouses of Rotarians, and Rotaractors.
- 3. Fellowship must be international in nature with active members in at least three countries.
- 4. Each fellowship elects at least three officers to oversee the group's administration.
- 5. Fellowships are expected to facilitate communication among their members and maintain regular communication with RI.
