ENTRY DETAILS AND RULES TO HELP YOU COMPETE FAIRLY

- Deadline for submission: 3PM Friday, Dec. 3, 2024. Your art will represent your thoughts on the 2025 theme "Peace 101: Finding Common Ground in a Divided World." Through your art, show the judges how you create, support, or imagine a peaceful local or global community. Winning art will be on display at the Nixon Library & Museum Jan. 25, 2025.
- Your art must be no larger than 11" X 14" (landscape or portrait).
- Your art canvas thickness should not exceed ¼ inch.
- All entries <u>must incorporate</u> a Rotary International or Rotary Interact symbol or logo clearly visible within the artwork. <u>The logo should be a significant part of the artwork</u>, not pasted or attached to the artwork. Google "Rotary International Logo" for examples.
- Media Choices: oil, pastel, charcoal, graphite, pen and ink, watercolor, marker, mixed media, graphic design, or photography.
- Students may submit one entry per media choice. Submitted artworks with names placed on the front of artwork will be disqualified.
- Winning selections will be displayed January 25, 2025 at the Rotary Peace Conference held at the Richard Nixon Library & Museum in Yorba Linda, CA from 8:00 AM – 12:00 PM and on the Rotary District 5300, 5320, 5330 Web pages: www.district5300.org and

- Entrants agree to allow their artworks to be published in Rotary International social and print media.
- Entrants may pick up their artwork immediately following the event. Artworks will not be mailed or returned by the committee.
- Each winner's award check will be presented at the Peace Conference to the student or student's school or Rotary Club representative.
